Sree Narayana Guru one of the epoch-making Seers of the present century has dynamically effected a radical change in the moral, social and spiritual values, vision and behavioral patterns of his contemporaries. Among the socio - religious reformers of modern India who clamored for social justice, the name of Sree Narayana Guru occupies a permanent place. The impact of the activities of sree Narayana Guru are so varied that it has reflected the whole state of Kerala in the field of education, religion, economy, politics and culture. Guru dedicated himself to the cause of social and moral regeneration of the backward communities in Kerala. 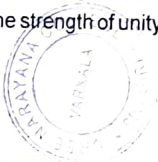

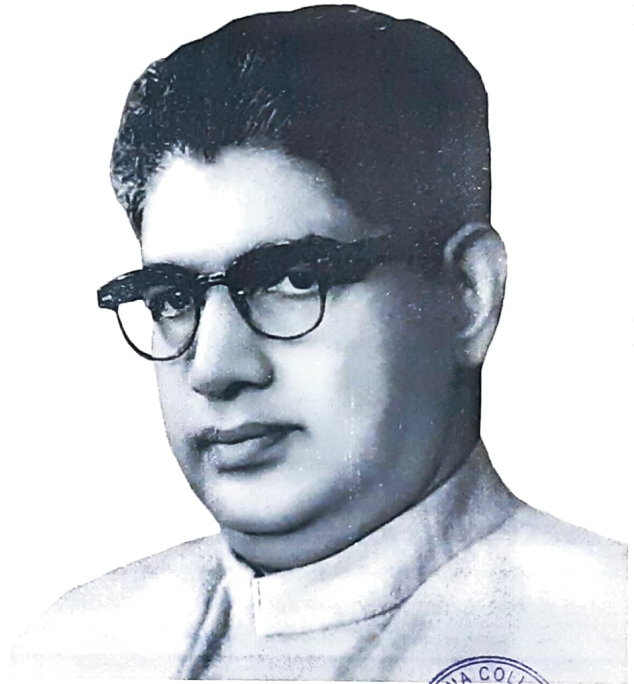

Sri. R. Sankar

Sri R Sankar was one of the towering figures in Kerala politics with his courageous and inimitable style of functioning. He became the third Chief Minister of Kerala, during one of the most turbulent periods in the state's political history. Being a strong-willed politician and social reformer, he had the courage of conviction to withstand any opposition. By creating more educational facilities, he laid the foundation for new avenues of higher education in the state, paving the way for the socially backward classes to come into the mainstream by utilizing the opportunities for higher education. He was elected to the Travancore assembly in 1948 and also became a member of the Travancore Cochin assembly from 1949 to 1956. Sri R Sankar was a member of the Constituent Assembly and also a member of the Franchise and Delimitation Commission and the Reforms Committee constituted after the introduction of the Responsible Government. He led the Congress Party as KPCC President during the 'Liberation Struggle'. The Congress won the elections in 1960 under Sri. Sankar's leadership and he became the deputy Chief minister in the Pattam Thanu Pillai ministry. When Sri. Pattam Thanu Pillai was appointed as Governor, Shri. R. Sankar become the Chief Minister of Kerala from September 26, 1962 to September 10, 1964. Sri. R. Sankar believed in the principles of Sree Narayana Guru to exhort people to get enlightened through education and to emerge stronger through the strength of unity.

History

The opening of Sree Narayana College, Sivagiri, marked the fulfilment of a long cherished dream of the Sree Narayana Dharma Paripalana Yogam and the Sree Narayana Trusts. Sree Narayana College, Sivagiri, Varkala is affiliated to the University of Kerala and managed by the Sree Narayana Trusts, Kollam, one of the leading educational agencies in the state.

Sree Narayana Guru, one of the greatest social reformers India has ever seen, believed that a downtrodden society could be regenerated only through education. "Liberation through education and strength through organization" was his message. Accordingly, he began spreading the message of education and started a few schools during his life time. Even in those days the idea of a college was in his mind. The site of this college was purchased by Swamiji himself, most probably with the idea of starting a college here.

Soon after starting the Sree Narayana colleges at Kollam and Kannur, the attention of the S.N.D.P. Yogam and the Sree Narayana Trusts turned to Varkala where the great Guru is having his eternal rest. With the hearty co-operation of the devotees of the Guru in Varkala Taluk, the college was established. The college was inaugurated by Sri.R.Sankar, the Chief Minister of Kerala, on 7th July, 1964. In the fourth year it was upgraded to a Degree College. On 24th July, 1967, the Degree classes were formally inaugurated. In 1981, it acquired the status of a P.G. College, when M.A programme in Economics was started. It was followed by an M.Sc. programme in Physics in the year 1995, an M.Sc programme in Analytical Chemistry in the year 2001 MSc programme in Geology in the year 2013 and M.Com International Trade in.

The college could achieve further academic growth in 2006 when the University of Kerala recognized the Post Graduate Department of Economics for this college as a Research Centre in Economics. This provides opportunity for students to pursue various research programmes, including Ph.D.

The college attained the highest laurel, when the National Assessment and Accreditation council honoured it with B+ grade in the academic year 2003-04, taking into account its academic performance and infrastructural facilities. The college was recredited by NAAC with B grade in the year 2015. In 2021, the college was recredited by NAAC with B++ grade (CGPA-2.84).

Vision and Mission

Sree Narayana College Sivagiri was established by SN Trusts and inaugurated by Sri.R.Sankar on 7th July 1964 to spread the high ideals of Sree Narayana Guru who considered education as an instrument for liberation from all types of oppressions. The college is located in the shrines of renowned global spiritual centres of Sree Narayana Philosophy- Sivagiri Mutt, Sree Narayana Gurukulam and East West University library. Guru's vision of a world of equality without any discrimination on the basis of caste, creed, religion and gender can be realised by imparting scientific temper in the minds of younger generation. Hence the college adopted its vision "Liberation through Education" as envisaged by Sree Narayana Guru, the guiding light of our college. The scientific temper along with spiritual values will liberate the youth to become socially responsible citizens and thereby contribute to nation building.

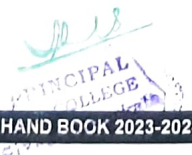

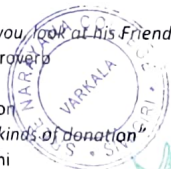

4. Withdrawal

- A student applying for a transfer certificate shall be given the certificate only on payment of all fees or other money due or such portion thereof as the principal may seem fit to demand for the academic year in which he was enrolled. A penalty of Rs. 50 will be collected from every student applying for his /her Transfer certificate after the first term of the academic year immediately following. Transfer Certificate of students who have appeared for a University Examination will be issued to them only after the publication of the results of the examinations (see last page for form of Application for Transfer Certificate)
- Any student applying for any certificate must state in the application all particulars required for identification viz. full name (with initials) class in which last studied, class number, admission number, group to which he/she belongs and the year in which he/she left the college. If a reply by post is desired a self addressed stamped envelope must be enclosed.
- A fee of Rs. 10 will be charged for the issue of a Conduct, Course, Identification or Medical Inspection Certificate from the present students of the college.
- A fee of Rs. 10 each will be charged for the issue of the following:-
 - Attendance, Conduct, Course, Identification or Medical Inspection Certificate after the lapse of a term since the student left the college.
 - A certified extract from any of the college record such as a certificate of date of birth.
- A fee of Rs 100 is charged for the issue of a duplicate Transfer Certificate.
- Any student who leaves the college without the written permission of the Principal before completing his course will receive no certificate of character. Any student who discontinues his study in the college without paying any arrears of fees or other dues shall receive no certificate.
- Caution money will be refunded only at the end of a course after clearing the dues, if any.

5. Residence of Students

- All students who do not live with their Parents or guardians shall reside only in lodgings approved by the principal.
- Students shall inform the college office full information regarding their residence, soon after admission.
- Change of residence, if any, should be reported immediately to the Principal

COLLEGE BY-LAWS

1. Admission to the First Degree Programme through online centralised allotment

Online Registration and Allotment Details

- > Based on eligibility, the candidate needs to register application online, for obtaining admission by opting multiple programmes in different colleges on a preferential basis. A maximum of 25 options shall be given in a single application.
- > Hard copies of the online application need not be sent to the University.
- > The marks obtained by the candidate at the Plus two/Higher Secondary Examination will be the basis of criteria for allotment/admission to the First Degree Programme.
- > The allotment of the candidates to various programmes in colleges will be on the basis of merit following strictly the rules and regulations of the University

2. Interview

Application provisionally selected for admission will be asked to appear before the Principal for interview on a specified date. The SSLC (Certificate to prove age) Transfer Certificate, Conduct Certificate, a Medical Inspection Certificate and the following record (all in original) shall be produced by the applicant at the interview
B.A/B.Sc./B.Com : mark lists of the Higher Secondary Examination and Medical Certificate, and

MA/M.Sc: Certificate and mark list, Conduct Certificate and Medical Inspection certificate shall be produced from the institution last attended.

Candidate appearing for interview must be accompanied by their guardians. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any candidate who has been called for interview without assigning reasons

3. Enrollment

The candidate who is selected at the interview will be enrolled immediately on payment of the first installment of tuition fees. The students belonging to backward classes who are eligible for full fee concession shall remit the caution and Laboratory deposits on enrolment. Students who are eligible for full fee concession shall remit the caution and Laboratory deposits on enrolment. Students who complete their course of study in March may collect their Caution Deposit refund before 1 May of the same year. The unclaimed amount will be remitted to Government. Those who wish to leave the college in the first term shall remit the fees for the full term.

No candidate after admission will be enrolled or allowed to attend any class until he/she has paid the first installment of tuition fee together with laboratory fee and other fees and Caution Deposit and Fees once collected will not be refunded.

6. Students Attendance

1. Attendance will be taken daily at the beginning of each period. Absence during one period will be counted for half the day.
2. There shall be no less than 90 working days in a semester excluding examination days. The minimum attendance for a semester is 75% of the total working days.
3. Students are required to occupy their respective seats before the beginning of each class. They are not allowed to leave the classroom without the permission of

7. Attendance Certificate

The grant of the certificate of attendance shall be subject to the following conditions.

- a. The certificate shall not be granted unless a student has completed the course of instruction to the satisfaction of the college authorities and his progress and conduct
- b. A minimum attendance of 75% of the total working days of the semester is required for the certificate. It is absolutely necessary for promotion and admission to the University Examination.
- c. Students whose attendance fall below this minimum shall apply for exemption through the principal to the University. The application for exemption shall be accompanied by a Treasury receipt of Rs. 100/- if the shortage is below 10 days and Rs. 200 if the shortage is between 10 and 20 days. The reason for each day's absence will have to be explained. In case of absence on account of illness a medical certificate is also has to be submitted. Exemption will not be granted more than once during a semester.

N.B:- No application for exemption will be recommended by the principal unless the principal is satisfied that the shortage of attendance was due to causes beyond the student's control. Ordinarily only long and continued illness will be accepted

8. Admission for a term making up shortage of Attendance

1. Students who are admitted for a term for making up shortage of attendance for the course which the student was undergoing should pay one-third of the tuition fees for the year together with full special fees and caution deposit at the time of admission. Only former students of the respective colleges should be admitted as term students.
2. In the case of readmitted students (undergoing one year's course) all fees including special fees and caution deposit due for the whole year will be collected at the time of admission.
3. Every student is liable to pay the prescribed fee for the whole term during any part of

Provided that a student studying in Arts and Science College and Sanskrit Colleges, for Degree or Postgraduate course, after obtaining transfer certificate from the institution is admitted to the same course of study in any other similar college, he/she shall not be called upon to pay over again the fees already paid for the term in the college which issued the T.C. But special fees and caution deposit will have to be paid again at the new College.

9. Leave of absence

1. No student shall absent himself from a class without prior permission.
2. Except for unforeseen causes, application for leave of absence recommended by the group tutor should reach the Principal before the commencement of the morning session (see last page for form of Application for leave)
3. A student absenting himself for ten consecutive working days shall have his/her name struck off the rolls and he/she shall be required to apply in the prescribed form for re-admission.
4. In the case of absence from any test paper, assignment or other exercise, the missed item must be answered and submitted to the teacher concerned. Otherwise the student shall not be given the attendance. He is also liable to other punishment.
5. Each student is expected to keep his own record of attendance. The list of attendance gained by students till the end of each month will be published at the beginning of the succeeding month.

10. Morning Prayer

Before the commencement of classes, every day, the "Daiva Dashakam", written by his Holiness Sree Narayana Guru, is played in the public address system. Staff and students should stand in reverential silence during the invocation.

11. General discipline

1. Students are expected to be clean and properly dressed in the classes and also at any meeting or gathering within the college premises.
2. Students should always wear their identity card when inside the campus.
3. Politics is banned within the campus
4. At the first bell before each session, students should move towards their respective classes and take their seats. When the teacher enters all shall arise and remain standing till teacher directs them to sit.
5. Students shall not misbehave and disturb the work of the class or of any other class.
6. No student shall leave the classroom, without the permission of the teacher or until the class is dismissed.
7. Students are not allowed to stand in the verandahs or corridors of the College during class hours. Students having no classes during the working hours shall go to the Library.
8. No students shall smoke within the college premises.

9. Students are forbidden from mishandling or damaging college property.
10. Circulation of notice of any kind among students, use of megaphones, mobilephones, loudspeakers etc, and putting up of posters in the college premises, without the written permission of the Principal are strictly prohibited.
11. Students are strictly forbidden in making complaints or representations in a body, in addressing any authority collectively.
12. No meeting of any kind shall be held in the college without the written permission of the Principal.
13. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual abstaining from class work, obscenity in word or act are sufficient reasons for minor offences is a fine.
14. The use of mobile phone in the campus by the student is prohibited as per Government order.
15. Malpractice in test paper and examination will render a student liable to serve punishment which might amount to refusal of promotion to the next class or expulsion from the college.
16. The use of mobile phone in the campus by the student is prohibited as per Government Order.
17. The Principal is empowered to fine or suspend or dismiss a student based on the gravity of the offence. Every offender will be given a chance to explain his/her conduct before punishment is given. However, a student may be sent out of the class at the discretion of the teacher concerned prior to further disciplinary action.
18. Students who are found persistently misbehaving in the College will run the risk of getting their fee and other concessions cancelled.
19. Students of B.Com HM should be groomed and wear proper uniform compulsorily.
20. No student or office bearer of any association shall give any matter regarding the activities of the College to the Press without the prior permission of the Principal.
21. No office bearer of any association shall mediate between the Principal and the Students in matters concerning discipline.

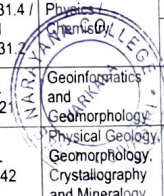

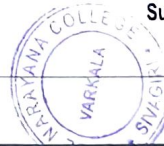

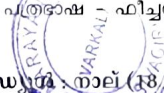

Two installments of tuition fee will be collected each in the 1st and 2nd terms.

Absence (with or without leave) from the college shall not be an excuse for non-payment of fee at the proper time.

Students belonging to Other Backward Community need not pay fees if their guardian's annual income does not exceed Rs. 1 lakh in the case of Degree students and Rs. 1 lakh in the case of Post-graduate students. Students who have exemption from the payment of fees under this rule must produce certificate from the Panchayat President/Municipal Chairman/ MLA/MP/Tahasildar of their place stating that they belong to the Other Backward Communities and guardian's income does not exceed the limits fixed for exemption from payment of fees.

Regulation Relating to the General library

1. The general library will function from 9am to 5 pm every day of a week except Sunday.
2. Books of reference will be issued to the students and they are not permitted to take home books belonging to the reference section.
3. A student is permitted to borrow only 2 books at a time and these should not be the copies of the same book.
4. Books taken out by students shall not be retained for more than 14 days. Failure to return a book on the due date entails a fine of Rs.1 per day for each book retained, Sundays and holidays being excluded.
5. Books taken for the vacation shall be returned with in the first three working days after the reopening.
6. Student against whom any fine or other charge is outstanding, will not be allowed to borrow books. If the fine is not paid with in a month, the student will not be permitted to attend class.
7. Transfer or sub-lending of book is strictly prohibited.
8. Marking, underline etc. in any book, manuscript, or belonging to the Library are absolutely forbidden.
9. Books which have been borrowed from the library must be returned forthwith when requisition is made by the librarian. Failure to do so will involve the liability to pay special fine.
10. When borrowing a book students shall bring to the notice of the Librarian any damage that may be in the book. Otherwise they will be held responsible for such damage.
11. For loss of books the following procedure will be followed. If new edition or copies of the lost books are available, the book has to be replaced by a new one. If the book is not available for the replacement the value of the lost books will be realised at the following rates. Trice of the face value of the books which were published prior to 1944. Twice the face value of the books which have been published in and after 1944. If the book value cannot be ascertained from the Library Stock Registers compensation will be fixed on the basis of the market price of similar publication at the time of fixation.

Reading Room

2. Any loss or damage will have to be compensated by the person responsible for it.
3. Strict silence should be maintained in the reading room.

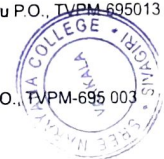
